

Pure Green Systems

Pre-Treatment Instructions

While services are performed, occupants should not be present or enter the treatment area at any time. **Pure Green Systems** heat remediation services take approximately 6-8 hours, with temperatures reaching 140-150 degrees Fahrenheit. Air moving equipment will be placed throughout the structure to distribute heat evenly. Please secure all loose paper and light material to prevent equipment intake, loss, damage, or destruction. Complete accessibility to the facility is imperative; your **Pure Green Systems** specialist will visit the location prior to treatment to evaluate the following: parking, access to premises, condition of area to be treated, and the extent and location(s) of the infestation. Please pay special attention to the additional instructions attached.

- A **Pure Green Systems** specialist will thoroughly inspect the premises to determine the extent of the infestation.
- Access to all closets, secure areas, garages, attics, and basements of the infested areas is critical.
- All suitcases, clothing, and everyday items normally found in the infested area should remain in the area to be treated.
- A **Pure Green Systems** specialist will open all closet doors, dresser drawers, kitchen cabinets, etc.
- A **Pure Green Systems** specialist will be removing clothing and linen from densely packed shelves and drawers to insure heat penetration.
- A **Pure Green Systems** specialist will be unplugging all electronic equipment such as computers, laptops, TV's, stereo's, etc. Please backup and power down these items!

The following items **MUST BE REMOVED!**

- All flammable items: gasoline, alcohols (including topical and drinking alcohol), charcoal lighter fluid, mineral spirits, lacquer thinner and paint thinner.
- Propane canisters, butane canisters, flammable-cleaning fluids, cigarette lighters, and lighter fluid.
- All combustible chemical compounds
- All wax compounds such as crayons, candles, lipsticks, and makeup.
- Any valuable artwork including valuable paintings, objects, carvings that may not withstand heat temperatures of 150 degrees Fahrenheit.
- All fire extinguishers, aerosol cans and compressed gas canisters.
- All pets: including dogs, cats, birds, gerbils, lizards, fish, etc.
- All firearms, ammunition, fireworks, and all other explosive hazards.
- All prescription medication and needles.
- All irreplaceable family heirlooms or inherited items; such as black and white photos or metallic linen photo albums
- All Unsecured jewelry and cash
- All personal items that would cause embarrassment or otherwise
- All plastic or vinyl LP records, CD's, DVD's, videotapes, camera supplies such as film and chemicals related to photography, etc.
- Any other item that may be damaged or pose a hazard when treated at 150 degree Fahrenheit.
